# One-Day Grain Grading Workshop for corn, sorghum & wheat handlers & producers

To help grain handlers recognize features that affect its grade, Texas A&M AgriLife **Extension Service will hold two one-day** workshops at the Texas A&M AgriLife **Research and Extension Center in** Amarillo. A workshop is offered on August 1 and repeated on August 2 and runs from 9:00am until 4:30pm. Participants will learn the importance of grading grain, become familiar with grain grading standards, develop proper sampling techniques, and identify different types of damage that occur and their potential impacts on grade and feeding value. Participants work hands-on with grain samples to enhance the learning experience.
